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## Community Park and Bluffview Park Update

Two park-construction projects by the City of Wildwood are underway and will be completed in 2015. The larger of these two projects is the Community Park, which is a 66-acre site that is located off State Route 100, just west of State Route 109. This project represents phase one of a multiple-phased approach to the property's ultimate development and use. In phase one, the City will provide a large and uniquely designed playground area that is fully accessible to all children, regardless of abilities, an expansive pavilion for picnics and other gatherings, and a one-and-one-half-acre dog park. A multiple-use trail is also planned, which will connect into the existing network to the east at State Route 109 and will also extend west to Pond Road. The facility will have other amenities in the future, but will always have ample areas of limited development to ensure outdoor enjoyment and respect for nature. This facility, along with the playground and dog park, are slated to open in early summer 2015.



Bluffview Park is over 100 acres, and located on Old State Road, to the east of State Route 109. This property is owned by St Louis County and leased to the City of Wildwood for development. The property extends from Old State Road to the Meramec River, and provides one of the best views in the region of the Crescent Valley.

In this park, the City and St. Louis County are developing a parking lot and roadway area to provide access to an existing trail system that has been available for use since 2014. This trail system is a natural-surface type that offers scenic views, strenuous climbs, and a wonderful outdoor experience for nature lovers. A different component of this park is that has been designed for equestrian users as well as for walkers, runners, bicyclists, and nature lovers. This park facility will be open for use by the spring of 2015, but the trail system is already accessible via the Al Foster Memorial Trail.

# Mayor's Message

Now I get to move on to the two items I mentioned as I started this message. It's early in the year, but you should know that when September 1, 2015 rolls around, the City of Wildwood will be celebrating its twentieth anniversary of incorporation. This is a milestone event and you can expect to hear a lot about marking the twentieth anniversary with unique and various activities throughout the year.

One activity I can talk about here is the historic recognition program that kicked off early in the year. We have always had a great deal of pride in the communities that made up this part of West St. Louis County before Wildwood incorporated. Those communities date back to before the Civil War, and our Historic Preservation Commission is working on ways to remember where we once started, and provide depth to residents' knowledge of the

history of our community. The Commission has been able to do so with roadside markers. Each marker is a sign about three feet high, and provides a description of the community where it's placed.

You are probably wondering now how many communities have been identified that are receiving the markers. There are eleven, and include Glencoe, Grover, Pond, Westland Acres, Centaur, Hollow, Orrville, Melrose, Kelpe, Monarch/Eatherton and Fox Creek. The plan is to roll out the markers throughout the year as part of celebrating our twentieth anniversary. You can expect to hear and see more about each marker as the year continues.

We have been fortunate in past years to offer a number of events throughout the year that provide everyone an opportunity to enjoy all that Wildwood has to offer. This year is certainly no different, but with the twentieth anniversary upon us, residents can expect to see references to our history and our future in each event. The markers are just the start of what I hope will be a banner year for the City.

I encourage you to plan on participating in one or all of the events that are scheduled

## New City Administrator Appointed

On January 12, 2015, Mayor Tim Woerther and the City Council appointed Ryan S. Thomas as Wildwood's new City Administrator. Thomas is no stranger to the City of Wildwood and has worked in the City's Department of Public Works since March 1996, serving as the department's Director since March 2001.

Mayor Tim Woerther alluded to the benefit of hiring someone already well acquainted with the City's operations and said, "We are fortunate to be able to hire someone with a long history and knowledge of Wildwood. Residents

should expect to continue receiving the same level of service and understanding of the unique qualities that make Wildwood a place we all call home."

Thomas expressed his appreciation for the chance to serve as the City's next City Administrator. "I am very grateful for this opportunity, and I have been very encouraged by the strong support shown by so many people in the community," said Thomas. "I have always found it very rewarding to have such an important role in Wildwood's progression as a City, and I expect this new role will create even greater opportunities to further my involvement in improving what is already such a great community." Thomas also acknowledged the support City staff has shown, saying, "I also expect the transition to this new position to occur quite smoothly, thanks to the great support of the City's very capable and dedicated staff."

Thomas was born and raised in Allentown, Pennsylvania, and moved to the St. Louis area to attend Washington University in 1991, where he earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Civil Engineering in 1995. He has resided in Wildwood with his family for the past ten years.

# Local Sales Tax a Major Source of Revenue for City's Operations

## Did You Know?

The City of Wildwood relies heavily on local sales tax receipts for providing basic services to its residents, including the operations of its seven (7) City Departments: Administration & Finance, City Clerk and Council, Municipal Court, Parks, Police, Planning and Public Works.

In total, these seven (7) City Departments have an annual Operating Budget of \$8,539,450, which is supported by an estimated \$9,129,100 in annual Operating Revenues (the City has a separate Capital Budget, with a separate set of revenue sources).

More than half of the City's Operating Revenues come in the form of local sales taxes, which are collected Countywide and partially redistributed to a pool of municipalities on a per capita basis. For decades, municipalities have pursued changes to the pooled sales tax system, as their local economies have changed and the pool became more or less advantageous to them. However, each proposed change would have benefitted certain municipalities, while harming others, and has not had the support necessary for passage by the State Legislature. However, each year the City of Wildwood continues to closely monitor any proposed new legislation, as most proposals to date would potentially cause great harm to the City of Wildwood (as well as numerous other municipalities).

The City of Wildwood does not impose a local property tax. A majority of your property taxes help support local schools, fire districts or other entities.

As demonstrated on the chart to the below, the City of Wildwood would potentially stand to lose 32% of its annual Operating Revenues, if the pool system was completely eliminated and sales taxes only collected at the point of sale. For the City of Wildwood and a majority of the municipalities within St. Louis County, the current pooled distribution of sales taxes has proven itself fair and effective for the region as a whole.

Certainly, the collection of local sales taxes is heavily concentrated within municipalities with large business areas; however, those businesses are supported by the citizens of all municipalities, which is precisely why it only makes sense to redistribute some of the collected sales taxes back to other municipalities where many of the shoppers reside.



# New Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRMs) Issued by FEMA

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has updated its mapping for all of St. Louis County. The City of Wildwood has also adopted the updated mapping in order to remain a participant in the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP). These maps represent the first major update since August 2, 1995, and contain much more accurate engineering information, such as new flood studies and topographic data. In some cases, the updated maps now identify greater or lesser impacted land areas.

The new Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRMs) and associated Flood Insurance Study (FIS) are available for public review at Wildwood City Hall during normal business hours, Monday through Friday, from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. The maps are also available for review on the City's website at the following link: <http://www.cityofwildwood.com/474/2015-FEMA-Maps>. Please be advised, these maps are very large files and do take some time to load.

The new maps went into effect on February 4, 2015. Accepted items include bicycles, tricycles, and bicycle parts. Donations are tax deductible. The donated bikes will be reconditioned by individuals working and training to make positive changes in their lives. Once the bikes are reconditioned, they will be donated to residents in our region who are in need.

This "Green" event is brought to you by the City of Wildwood and BicycleWORKS, a 501(c)3 not-for-profit organization that was founded in 1988 to give area "at-risk" youths a place to develop skills, interact with peers and caring adults, and safely challenge their abilities.

# One-Stop Shredding and Electronics Recycling Event

Once again, Wildwood will make it easy for area residents to have documents safely shredded, and to dispose of unwanted electronics with the City's annual Electronics Recycling and Shredding Events; and like last year, the City will make it even more convenient by offering both events on the same day and at the same location.

On Saturday, May 2, from 8:00 a.m. to noon, at the St. Louis Community College-Wildwood campus, located at 2645 Generations Drive in Wildwood, you can have documents and digital-document sources safely shredded, and at the same time drop off unwanted electronics for recycling. The combination Shredding and Electronics Recycling Event is open to both residents and nonresidents.

**This will be the City's Sixth Annual Shredding Event**, and all materials shredded that day will be recycled, not sent to area landfills. By making sure documents, data disks, empty prescription bottles and other such items are securely shredded before they are disposed of, you can help reduce your risk of becoming a victim of identity theft.

The shredders to be used are heavy-duty and able to handle many things that are beyond the scope of small, personal shredders. That means you don't have to go through stacks of papers to strip away everything but paper. It also means you can easily dispose of some digital-document sources.

Some things cannot be shredded, however, and should not be included with the drop-off. Below are lists of what can and cannot be shredded.

### What CAN be shredded:

- Paper (colored/white/newspaper)
- Paper Clips
- Binder Clips
- Folders
- CDs
- Rubber Bands
- Pill Bottles (without pills)

### What CANNOT be shredded:

- Cardboard boxes
- Hard-drives
- Batteries
- Vinyl binders
- Medical Waste (medicine/needles/etc.)

**This will also mark the City's Seventh Annual Electronics Recycling Event.** Last year, nearly 57,647 pounds of electronics were kept out of local landfills when more than 812 motorists took advantage of the City's Electronics Recycling event. **Some of the electronics you can recycle at this year's event include:**

- Computers and all of their accessories
- Networking and telecommunications equipment, phones of all types, clocks
- TVs, VCRs, DVD players, stereos, A/V equipment, including cable and satellite boxes
- Home electronics and small appliances

In addition to getting rid of unwanted electronics, you can feel good about knowing all the electronics collected that day will be disposed of in an environmentally-responsible manner.

# Road Improvements Around the City

## Route 109 Improvement Project Completed

After years of planning, major improvements to Route 109 (between Route 100 and Clayton Road) were substantially completed at the end of 2014. The improvements include two new roundabouts, additional travel lanes, a new pedestrian bridge, a new pedestrian tunnel, and the extension of Pond-Grover Loop Road to the west of Route 109. Remaining landscaping work is scheduled for completion this spring.

The City of Wildwood and the Missouri Department of Transportation (MoDOT) partnered on the project. Approximately \$4.5 million in Federal transportation funding secured by the City of Wildwood was used to finance this project. The project would likely not have been possible without this extra funding.

With the completion of these improvements along this section of Route 109, the City and MoDOT plan to further improve Route 109 to both the south and north in the future. In 2015, design will commence on another roundabout at the south end of the Route 109 bridge, over Route 100. The addition of a roundabout at this location should further improve traffic flow in this congested area of the City. The construction phase for this project is tentatively planned for 2016.



## Other Roadway Improvement Projects Recently Completed

While much attention has been given to Route 109 this past year, a few other notable roadway improvement projects have been recently completed by the City. Listed below are three of these projects.

1. Roadside safety barriers were installed along Route 100, between Taylor Road and

Westglen Farms Drive, where the City's trail system runs closely alongside the highway.

2. Sidewalk and streetscape improvements were installed along Manchester Road, near Schnucks – Wildwood Crossing.
3. Several City roadways were resurfaced, including Wild Horse Creek Road, Church Road, and several streets in the Downtown Wildwood Town Center.

## City's Master Plan Under Review in 2015

Wildwood is known as the community that is always "Planning Tomorrow Today." We adhere to this principle in all aspects of our long-range decision-making processes relating to land use, transportation, open space and parks, and resident services. The document used for these purposes is the City's Master Plan. The Master Plan was first adopted in 1996, updated in 2006, and must be reviewed again in 2015 for re-adoption in 2016—its 20-year anniversary. This ten-year review cycle of the City's Master Plan is set by State Statute and City Charter.

The review and update of this important document will begin in January 2015, and conclude by February 2016. During this 13-month process, a group of resident volunteers will consider all aspects of the Master Plan's current format and language, and determine if any part, or all of it needs to be updated. This group will include ten residents, the eight citizen members of the Planning and Zoning Commission, the Mayor, two City Council liaisons, and two business interests from the City. Working together they will depend on a number of resources to assist them in this update process; one of the most important of these resources being resident input on the Master Plan and its effectiveness in maintaining Wildwood as a great place to live, work, and play.

To ensure maximum effectiveness of this review process, the City is

seeking resident input and will provide many ways for residents and others to provide it. Input avenues will include public sessions, a web-based survey, mailers, and attendance at monthly meetings that will have a public-comment section as part of each meeting. As noted, one (1) of these avenues for input are the public sessions, with the first to be held on Wednesday, February 18, 2015, at (place) starting at 7:00 p.m.; and the second of them to be held on Wednesday, March 11, 2015, at (place). At these public input sessions, you will be given an opportunity to talk about the Master Plan and all things Wildwood, which will help the committee of resident volunteers appointed by Mayor Woerther, who are responsible for this update process, better understand the considerations that need to be discussed as part of it.

# Your 2015 City Council Candidates

On April 7th, Wildwood voters will elect the candidates who will serve as their representatives on the Wildwood City Council. As the legislative branch and governing body of the City, the City Council's major function is to adopt policy, which normally takes the form of ordinances, resolutions, and budget adoptions.

City Council candidates are elected only by residents of the Wards in which the candidates live and are elected to represent. Generally, City Council Members from each of the City's eight Wards serve staggered, two-year terms, which results in one new Council Member from each Ward being elected every April. This year, however, to fill vacancies on the Council, two candidates will be elected to office in Wards Two and Seven. In each of those Wards, the candidates who receive the most votes in their Ward will serve the usual two-year term. The candidates with the second highest number of votes in Wards Two and Seven will serve one-year terms.

Larry W. McGowen is running unopposed for Council Member in Ward One. 

Voting is a privilege many people in the world aren't afforded. Make sure you're ready to go to the polls and vote on April 7, and then exercise the privileged opportunity you have. Below is a checklist that can help you know if you're ready to vote that day. \* For more information about voting in St. Louis County, contact the St. Louis County Board of Elections at (314) 615-1800, or go to their website at [www.stlouisco.com/YourGovernment/Elections](http://www.stlouisco.com/YourGovernment/Elections).

### **Be sure you're registered to vote by or before March 11.**

The last day to register to vote in the April 7 election is March 11. To make registering to vote easy and convenient, the St. Louis County Election Board maintains over 600 registration sites. These include most city halls, libraries and schools in addition to Special School

District facilities, local branches of the Junior College Districts, the Univ. of MO-St. Louis, and various businesses, union halls and churches. State election laws also provide for registration by mail, at all motor vehicle registration offices and all state offices providing public assistance. For more information, or for the location of your nearest registration site, call (314) 615-1822.

### **Notify the Board of Elections of any changes to your name or address.**

If you've moved or changed your name since you last registered to vote, you'll need to notify the Election Board, either in writing or in person, at any of the registration sites. The Election Board needs your change of address by the fourth Wednesday before an election to ensure that you receive a postcard notification of your polling place and that you are listed in the polling place binder. If you did not notify the Election Board of your address change, you'll need to call their office to determine your new polling place.

### **If you're unable to go to the polls on April 7, apply for an Absentee Ballot.**

If you wish to apply for an Absentee Ballot by mail, please contact the St. Louis County Board of Elections at (314) 615-1800 or by downloading an application form from the St. Louis County Board of Elections Web page at [www.stlouisco.com/YourGovernment/Elections](http://www.stlouisco.com/YourGovernment/Elections). Only those who will be prevented from going to the polls on election day for one of the following reasons may vote by absentee ballot. 1) Voters who will be absent from St. Louis County on election day. 2) Incapacity or confinement due to sickness or disability, including caring for a person who is incapacitated or confined due to sickness or disability. 3) Religious belief or practice. 4) Employment by the Election Board. 5) Imprisonment, provided all other qualifications for voting are retained.

# Be Informed— Protect Yourself from Scams

The St. Louis County Wildwood Precinct has recently received an increased volume of calls from people reporting scam attempts. Most callers recognized something didn't seem right about the call, and didn't provide the personal or financial information the scammer requested. Some callers wanted to check with us before they called the party back with credit card numbers or using Western Union to send money, which stopped the fraud from occurring. Other callers, unfortunately, had already fallen victim to very convincing, malicious scams.

Scams are not new, but they are changing to fit with the times. Generally, scams play on people's emotions or fears in order to get them to act quickly, without thought; and the only way to fix the situation is to pay a sum of money to avoid arrest, tax liens, or to get a family member or friend out of jail or a bad situation. Scammers usually set immediate or very short time frames for people to respond, so victims won't have time to check out the situation.

To make them appear legitimate, many scammers will provide callback numbers. When you call the number, it is answered by someone posing as an information officer for the department or organization the scammer said they represented. They have multiple people involved, so when you ask for the person who originally called you, they transfer you and now the situation appears to be authentic, when it's really a scam.

Three scams we most commonly hear about in this area are the Grandparent Scam, Tax Scams and the Utility Bill Pay Scam.

The Grandparent Scam is when someone receives a call or e-mail from a person claiming to be a friend or relative with an emergency. Most commonly it's a grandparent who receives a call at night from someone claiming to be their distressed grandchild. The impersonator sounds as though they are crying or upset, making voice recognition difficult. The

caller then gives the phone to someone else to talk on their behalf. The situations they present may change, but the requests are always the same—send money via wire transfer and everything will be alright.

The Tax Scam is usually a phone call from someone posing as an Internal Revenue Service agent, who claims you owe money. They will ask for payment via a wire transfer or pre-loaded credit card, saying this is the only way you can avoid arrest or the revocation of your driver's license. Sometimes to support the original caller's claim, scammers will follow up with a call from someone identifying themselves as a local police officer. Fear and a feeling of urgency too often end with people sending the money without realizing it was a scam.

In the St. Louis area, most people know what company provides the utilities for a particular area, making the Utility Bill Pay Scam easy. Someone calls a residence or business, claiming to be from the utility provider and saying payment for service hasn't been received. The caller claims services will be turned off unless the bill is paid within the next hour, via wire transfer or pre-loaded debit card. Again, they will often provide a callback number, which, if called, is answered by what sounds like a company representative. Often they will even transfer your call to make the scam seem more authentic. Once the wire is sent or the pre-loaded card number is given, the money is gone.

So how do you avoid becoming a victim? Unfortunately, because of the variety of scams operating, there is no one answer. Your first defense, however, is to become aware scams can happen to anyone. Question the call, and deal with the matter on your time, not the time someone else tells you. Tell the caller you will call the company or organization they say they represent the following day, and that you will use the number you have in your records. Don't use the number they provide. If a supposed friend or family member is in need, tell the caller you need to talk to them personally, and then ask questions that only they would know the answer to. Last of all, if you feel unsure, call the police and we will verify the information for you.

## Rural Internet Access Efforts Continue

Many of the readers of the City's Gazette over the last seven years know that Wildwood officials and a group of volunteers have been trying to address the poor high-speed Internet access conditions that currently exist in many of Wildwood's rural areas in the overall community. For many years these efforts resulted in very little improvements, despite pleas for assistance from residents, volunteers, and City officials, traditional and non-traditional providers of Internet access would not participate or offer solutions to this problem. Many avenues were pursued by the City and its representatives, but nothing in terms of high-speed Internet access changed for many owners of rural properties in Wildwood.

It was not until 2013 that changes began to occur in terms of service to these rural areas of the City. This success was a function of two providers the City was able to encourage to bring their wireless services to Wildwood. These providers were BaysET and Whisper ISP. With these providers in place, the City installed 11 Internet towers in the north and south halves of the rural areas of this community. These towers form the backbone of the wireless network of service. Unfortunately, since the two providers of this Internet service use a line-of-sight service type, the extent of coverage of their respective networks has not been as extensive as had been hoped by all parties.

Given the extent of initial service, the providers have been working on repeater locations to extend the range of the wireless signal to the hard-to-reach places in the rural areas of Wildwood. These repeaters have been placed on private lots, homes, and other locations to extend the signal and obtain further coverage. Additionally, the providers have been investing in new equipment to improve their signal strength and coverage. The City has assisted in these efforts and wants to find locations that still need service. If you have not yet received coverage from one of the two aforementioned providers and are interested, please visit the City's website at [www.cityofwildwood.com](http://www.cityofwildwood.com), and type into the "Search Bar" the phrase "rural internet access needs." From there a comment form will be made available for you to complete. Let us know your needs and we will do whatever we can to address them.
